And in the district my team and I had the opportunity to join our community members for big projects and celebrations as we kick off the year. We also were able to celebrate some of the outstanding women who make such outstanding contributions through their work and advocacy during our annual Women of Distinction event. I hope the month treated many of you well and I look forward to seeing you throughout April!

## **LEGISLATIVE UPDATE**

This year, my team and I are authoring two bills to help bring some reform to our elections here in California. The influx of money in our political system can often leave many feeling unheard by their elected representatives. To meet this moment, SB 42 would lift the ban on cities publicly funding elections. This would allow non-charter cities to get money out of politics and give candidates equal opportunities to seek public office. We are also authoring SB 398 to prohibit lotteries for voter registration like we saw in 2024 and this week in Wisconsin. These bills help prevent affluence from being the deciding factor, rather than a candidates positions and priorities for our communities.
